Instructions for Audio Projects

YouTube allows easy storage and access to video and audio files. To store an audio project, the file must be saved in a video file format, such as .mov, .wmf, or .avi. Note that YouTube does not refer to audio files; you must think of your audio file in terms of a video file. Visit the YouTube Help Center, by following the link provided on the Audio|Video page.

We have provided a link to download Audacity. Audacity is one of the best audio editing applications on the Internet. It is an open source project, cross platform (Windows or Mac), and it is FREE. We have also linked to a basic tutorial for using Audacity.

- After making your audio recording, you will want to download it to your audio editor (Audacity or the program you will be using).
- After editing your file in your audio editor, copy and paste it into your video editing application (such as iMovie or Movie Maker).
- At this point, you may want to create a title slide and a credit slide, as well as other information concerning your audio project.
- Your audio file is now part of a movie file.
- Save the movie file, upload it to You Tube, provide some search descriptors, and preview it in You Tube.
- If you are satisfied with your project, copy the embed code for your movie, and save it for later use in the Open Channels' database.
